

BOND REFERENDUM

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 2024



In the past 20 years, the Decorah Community School District has built a middle school and renovated the high school and Carrie Lee Elementary School. **It's now time to turn our attention to the youngest students in our district.**

On **Tuesday, November 5**, voters will consider a **\$38 million** general obligation bond referendum to fund the construction of a new facility to replace John Cline Elementary School and West Side Early Childhood Center.

The decision to pursue this bold project comes after more than 15 years spent assessing the district's needs, engaging with residents, and thoroughly considering multiple project options.

An approved bond referendum would allow us to:



Create a 21st century learning environment for grades PK-2



Provide young students with more resources and opportunities



Allow DCSD to retain and attract quality staff members



Appeal to new families and students



PROPERTY TAX IMPACT

The tax impact of an approved bond would be \$0.86 per year on \$1,000 of taxable property value. For a home with an assessed value of \$250,000, this increase would amount to \$7.96 per month.
